A video of a photoshoot features a male model in a Geeklist t-shirt, shorts, and sandals and a female model in a Geeklist t-shirt and underwear. When a significant portion of the population sees this video, they associate Geeklist with the objectification of women, which reduces engagement.

Steps to reproduce

1. Show someone the <u>video</u>.

Expected result

Person reacts positively and associates Geeklist with their inclusive brand of being the "world's largest Geek community", making them more likely to sign up.

Actual result

Person wonders where the female model's pants went, associates Geeklist with a "Maxim" ethos in which women are seen as being objects whose presence is exclusively related to male visual enjoyment, is alienated and angry. Due to the fact that people talk to each other, this bug may produce cascading brand failures in a production environment.

Notes

This was originally reported via <u>Twitter</u> but that produced a 500 CT0 Defensive And Touchy response. Should I open a separate issue for that?


